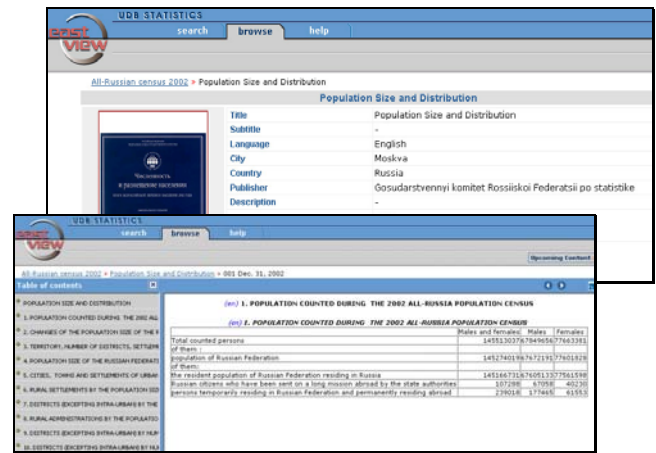


## UDB-Census 2002 All-Russian Population Census Translated into English and online

The much-anticipated 2002 Census of the Russian Federation, conducted over a one-week time period in October 2002, was officially declared a success with 70% of the population taking part. The 2002 All-Russian Population Census, published by the State Committee on Statistics of the Russian Federation, comprises 14 volumes.

Originally in Russian, East View has translated into English this exhaustive demographic snapshot of post-Soviet Russia and making it available online.
