CHERNOBYL NEWSPAPERS (1979-1990)

Three previously unavailable local newspapers — *Tribuna Energetika*, *Prapor peremogi*, and *Tribuna pratsi* — published in towns in and near the exclusion zone. Ideal resources for the study of the social background surrounding the Chernobyl disaster.

DEMOKRATYCHNA UKRAINA (1992-2020)

(Демократична Україна, Democratic Ukraine)

Originally published in Russian, this newspaper was renamed in 1991 and started publishing in Ukrainian. The editorial policies encourage a new kind of journalism valuing democratic ideals.

DONETSK AND LUHANSK NEWSPAPERS (2013-2018)

This database of ten rare newspapers from the self-proclaimed Donetsk and Luhansk republics of Ukraine covers the period of military hostilities between the unrecognized states and the government of Ukraine. Sources primarily in Russian.

HOLOS UKRAINY (FROM 1991)

(Голос України, Voice of Ukraine)

Covers everyday activities in Parliament and work done by various parliamentary committees. Includes news related to the latest developments in politics, economics, the international and social scene, sports, and the arts.

NARODNA ARMIIA (1991-2018)

(Народна армія, People's Army)

The successor to the Soviet military publication of the Ukrainian SSR, *Leninskoe znamia*, this publication covered the creation and reform of the Armed Forces of Ukraine. Correspondents also covered the activities of Ukrainian peacekeepers in UN operations in Bosnia-Herzegovina and the activities of the Ukrainian-Polish battalion in Kosovo.

NARODNA HAZETA (1990-2009)

(Народна газета, People's Newspaper)

The continuation of the short-lived *Rukh* (1989-1990), with the motto" For the unity of national-democratic forces." This proindependence, anti-communist newspaper provided detailed coverage of the lead-up to the first democratic elections held in the Ukrainian SSR. It ceased due to bankruptcy in 2009. Published in Kyiv, in the Ukrainian language.

NEZAVISIMOST' (1991-2002)

(Независимость, Independence)

This was the Russian-language successor publication to *Komsomolskoe znamya* (initially called *Stalinskoe plemya* [Stalin's Tribe]), with a long history as a Soviet publication.

PRAVDA UKRAINY (1938-2014)

(Правда Украины, Ukraine Truth)

The newspaper of record from 1938, *Pravda Ukrainy* covered party opinions on politics, culture, economics and other issues, until the August coup of 1991. Afterwards, it embraced democratic principles and independent journalism, until it ceased in 2014.

ZA VIL'NU UKRAINU (1990-2006)

(За вільну Україну, For a Free Ukraine)

Founded in July 1990 in L'viv by the Regional Council of Workers' Deputies with the stated purpose of uniting national-patriotic forces and Ukrainian ideals. Its circulation peaked at nearly one half million, and it was distributed in Ukraine, Poland, Germany, France, Belgium, the US, Canada, Brazil, and Australia.

Historical Research Collections

East View's historical research collections come from many different sources: previously classified military documents, materials from the State Archives of the Kyiv Oblast, and more. UKRAINIAN STUDIES

East View's Ukrainian Studies research collections are primary source documents covering uprisings against the Russian Empire, the Prosvita Society (a pro-Ukrainian cultural organization), the Stolypin assassination, the short-lived government and secret police of Hetman Skoropadsky, and Ukraine under Nazi occupation, including querilla activities during Nazi occupation.

UKRAINE BETWEEN THE WARS

Primarily concentrated between the years 1912 and 1929, the items in this collection illuminate the concerns of intellectuals and politicians during Ukrainians' early attempts at statehood and initial experience of Sovietization. Many books, especially those depicting artwork, are richly illustrated in full color. Most of the materials were published in Ukraine, Russia and the Soviet Union, but a handful of books were printed in important centers of Ukrainian émigré life such as Canada, Germany, France, the U.K., and the U.S.

NEW CONTENT ADDED! THE CHERNOBYL COLLECTION. DOCUMENTS AND MAPS

Recently declassified documents makes fresh research into the causes and the consequences of the Chernobyl disaster not only possible but urgent, allowing researchers, policymakers, environmentalists, and nuclear industry insiders unprecedented insight into the Ukrainian and Soviet decision-making process. The collection was recently transferred to the new user-friendly interface, allowing researchers to use faceted filters to browse by Document Source, Document Type, Personalities, and Year. The collection was updated with more than 70 high-resolution maps of the area using i3F technology for a detailed view of location.

JUDAICA DIGITAL COLLECTIONS

East View produces a variety of valuable collections for researchers and graduate level students in Judaic studies. Spanning the period from the Russian Empire in 1857 to the Soviet era in 1929, the collections include documentation from important historical events, such as Kyiv's Bloody October of 1905 and the Beilis Case. Topics covered include: emigration from Ukraine both before and during the Soviet era; anti-Semitic groups, ethnic tension, and resulting pogroms; Jewish societies and education programs; and more.





LOCAL AND INDEPENDENT UKRAINIAN NEWSPAPERS: (1991-2002)

The newest community-driven project with the Center for Research Libraries is the **Local and Independent Ukrainian Newspapers** collection. This community-supported collection presents over 900 titles, offering scholars a regionally diverse archive preserving the first decade of post-Soviet press across Ukraine. The collection is available as Open Access to scholars at affiliated institutions of the Center for Research Libraries.

The collection includes local newspapers of record from over 340 cities and towns across Ukraine. All told, it features dozens of publications from each of the 25 provincial-level units of Ukraine, including Crimea. The majority of titles are in Ukrainian (about 80%) and in Russian (about 15%), with other languages represented, including Azeri, English, German, Hebrew, Polish, Crimean Tatar, and more.

Featuring content not found in any existing East View digital archive or database, the Local and Independent Ukrainian Newspapers collection provides researchers with a snapshot of Ukraine at a pivotal moment in its history, with hyper local coverage bringing to light regional and ethnic interests and concerns.

COMING SOON! SOVIET-ERA UKRAINIAN NEWSPAPERS

This archive will offer broad coverage of Ukraine during its history as part of the USSR, providing a complement to East View's Ukrainian Publications (UDB-UKR) database and the titles in the Local and Independent Ukrainian Newspapers collection, which covers the early post-Soviet years. The collection is available as Open Access to scholars at affiliated institutions of the Center for Research Libraries.
