WORLD POPULATION DAY – JULY 11, 2025

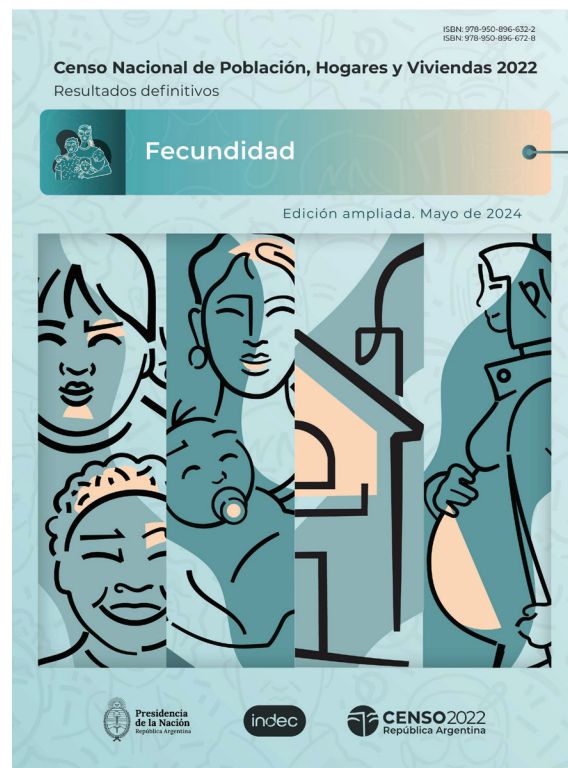
Currently at 8.2 billion, the world population is expected to reach roughly 10.3 billion by the mid-2080s. After the peak at the end of this century, numbers are anticipated to decline gradually. While fertility rates in all European countries, the U.S., China, Japan, and Russia are in decline, countries in sub-Saharan Africa are witnessing significant population growth.

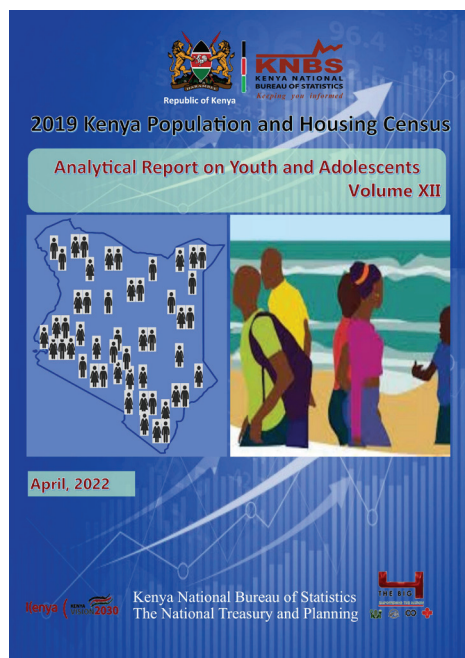
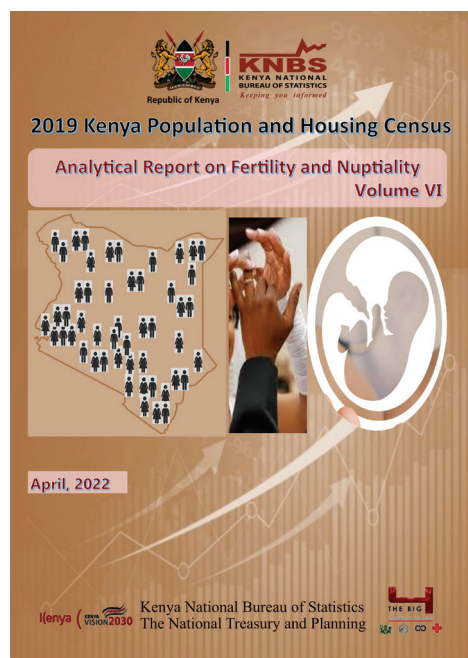

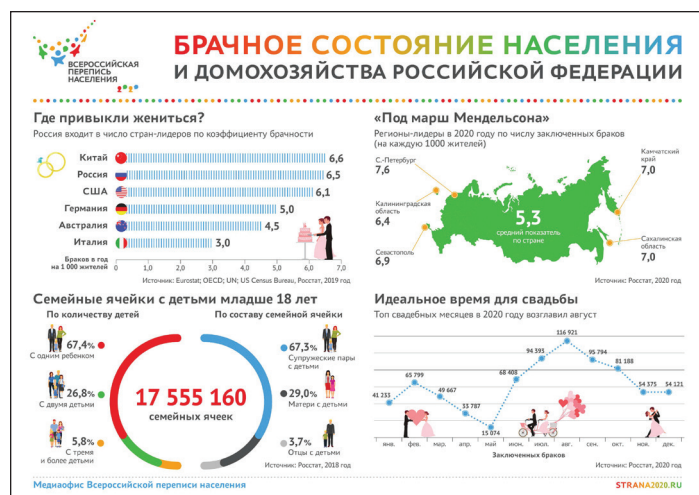


Left: Kenya, 2019. Census Results. v06. Fertility, Nuptiality. Global Census Archive.
